

FRENCH DRIFT CHAMPIONSHIP

This regulation supplements or amends the standard Drift regulation

The present regulations have been drafted in French and English. In the event of any dispute regarding its interpretation, only the French version shall be considered the official version.

ARTICLE 1. ORGANISATION

The FFSA organises the French Drift Championship.

1.1. REGULATION

The sporting regulations will be those of the standard regulations.

The cars allowed will be those of the Drift technical regulations.

The Drift Technical and Safety Rules (TSR) are applicable.

1.2. CALENDAR

The French Drift Championship will take place at the following competitions:

9.2. FINAL OVERALL RANKING

The points obtained, taking into account the ranking and any coefficients applied during the competitions selected for the Championship, will be added up. The winner will be the driver who has earned the most points throughout the season.

All results count.

Any ties will be resolved in accordance with Article III, Paragraph A of the FFSA General Regulations.

A competitor cannot accumulate points earned in the LEISURE category, **the French Pro Championship, and the French Elite Championship**

The winner of the Pro category will be crowned the French Drift Pro Champion. In the event that 6 female drivers are ranked in the Championship, a French Drift Pro Female Champion title will be awarded to the highest-ranked female. The winning team will also be named the French Drift Pro Champion Team and will be honoured at the FFSA awards ceremony.

The winner of the Elite category will be crowned the French Drift Elite Champion. In the event that 6 female drivers are ranked in the Championship, a French Drift Elite Female Champion title will be awarded to the highest-ranked female.

The winner of the Leisure category will be crowned the French Drift Leisure Champion or Female French Drift Leisure Champion (minimum of 6 drivers ranked) and will be honoured at the FFSA awards ceremony.

ARTICLE 10. PRICE

Trophies and rewards will be distributed at a minimum according to the standings of the *Pro and Elite* French Championship.
